- Whereas, Memorial Day provides a time to remember with reverence those who have fought to bring us peace which enables us to live as citizens of the greatest nation in the world with civil liberties envied and emulated by nations around the globe; and
- Whereas, Members of the Senate have served in each of our nation's wars; and

- Whereas, The Library of the Senate has opened a new exhibit, "We Remember: Service to the State and Vation," remembering past and present members of the Senate for their service to this Commonwealth and nation; therefore be it
- Resolved, That the Senate join all residents of this Commonwealth in remembering the sacrifices that have been made by those who came before us, so that we may enjoy the freedoms we have today, and let us honor our veterans and pay tribute to them on Memorial Day and all year-round; and be it further
- Resolved, That the Senate join the Library of the Senate in honoring the memory of many members of the Senate whose lives were distinguished by service to the people of this Commonwealth and the nation.
